This instruction implements AFPD 33-1 and references are contained in AFI 33-106. It establishes procedures and assigns responsibility for the use of nontactical land mobile radios (LMR), alternately known as intrabase radios (IBR). It applies to all personnel operating LMRs in the 305 RQS.

**SUMMARY OF REVISIONS**

This revision changed titles and added procedures. Updated radio assignment, location, and call signs and added channels. A (I) indicates revisions from previous edition.

**1. Responsibility.** The NCOIC, Ground Radio Operations (SCS) is the LMR Net Manager. The LMR Net Manager duties are outlined in AFI 33-106 and in the host-base LMR Net Manager's Program controlled by the 355th Communications Squadron (CS).

**2. Procedures:**

2.1. Do not leave radios unattended. When not in use, turn radios off and place in the battery charger within the assigned work centers.

2.2. Do not use profane language over the radio net.

2.3. Do not discuss classified information over the radio net.

2.4. SCS will schedule repair of LMRs through 355 CS.

2.4.1. Report malfunctions in the maintenance complex to Plans, Scheduling, and Documentation (LGLP) at 8-5323.

2.4.2. Report malfunctions for the pararescue section to Chief, Pararescue (DOJ).

2.4.3. All other operations and commander staff functions will report malfunctions directly to SCS at 8-2230.

2.5. It is imperative all applicable sections notify SCS of any actions regarding LMRs.
