This instruction implements AFRPD 31-1, *Physical Security*, and extends the guidance of established policies in implementing DOD 5200.8-R, *Physical Security Program*, and the Internal Security Act of 1950 (50 U.S.C. 797) for the protection of USAF resources located on or under the jurisdiction administration, custody, or in any way associated with General Mitchell IAP-ARS WI. It applies to all military and civilian personnel assigned to the 440<sup>th</sup> Airlift Wing, and to all personnel visiting General Mitchell IAP-ARS WI.

**SUMMARY OF REVISIONS**

This revision incorporates and implements proprietary jurisdiction information within paragraphs 3 and 5 and 5.1.1. A (I) indicates revisions from the previous edition.

**1. Responsibility.** The 440 Support Group Chief of Security Forces has the primary responsibility for enforcement of this instruction. All military and civilian personnel are responsible for taking lawful actions necessary to protect physical resources under their jurisdiction, administration, custody, or with which they are in any way associated.

**2. Location.** General Mitchell IAP-ARS is geographically located in Milwaukee County, Wisconsin. It is bounded on the south by East College Avenue, on the west by South Howell Avenue, on the north by property occupied by Wisconsin Air National Guard facilities and a portion on the northwest side by a civilian car rental agency, and on the east by property of Milwaukee County. The base is located at the southwest corner of the civilian airport property with a single entrance to the base from East College Avenue open on a daily basis. A second entrance to the base from South Howell Avenue is used for special events and occasions.

**3. Base Status .** General Mitchell IAP-ARS is a proprietary jurisdiction status with the Milwaukee Police Department, and is designated a closed base in accordance with AFI 31-209, *The Air Force Resource Protection Program*.

**4. Entrance .** Entrance to General Mitchell IAP-ARS is prohibited without the consent of the installation commander. All persons entering General Mitchell IAP-ARS agree to a search of their person and or vehicle in accordance with Section 21, Internal Security Act of 1950, 50 U.S.C. 797.

**5. Violators.** Persons subject to the provisions of the Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ), who violate the entrance requirements to General Mitchell IAP-ARS, will be disciplined under the applicable section of the UCMJ. Persons not subject to the provisions of the UCMJ, who are apprehended for violation of entrance requirements, will be removed from the base and ordered not to reenter. A written notice will be given to them personally. In addition, they are subject to arrest for trespassing by the Milwaukee Police Department.

5.1. If they cannot be identified, "John Doe" designations may be substituted for their names. The notice will contain the following warning:

5.1.1. Provisions of 18 U.S.C. 1382, states in part: "...**Whoever enters or is found within any installation, after having been removed therefrom or ordered not to reenter by any officer or person in command thereof, shall be fined not more than \$500.00, or imprisoned not more than six months, or both.**"

**6. Installation Warning Signs.** Installation warning signs will be utilized in accordance with AFI 31-209. They will be displayed at each entrance to the installation and around the perimeter of the installation, so they can be easily read by persons approaching on foot or in vehicles. The signs will be placed not more than 100 yards apart.

**7. Controlled Areas .** Controlled areas for General Mitchell IAP-ARS are listed in Tab A to Appendix 1 to Annex C, of the 440 AW Installation Security Plan 31-101-97.

**8. Controlled Area Warning Signs .** The warning signs will be utilized in accordance with AFI 31-209. Custodians of facilities and areas listed as controlled areas in paragraph 7, are responsible for submitting a AF Form 332, **Base Civil Engineer Work Request**, to the 440th Support Group Civil Engineering for the procurement and installation of signs for their particular areas. Coordination for proper placement of "Controlled Area" signs are to be made with 440th Support Group Security Forces.

**9. Restricted Areas .** Restricted areas for General Mitchell IAP-ARS are listed in 440 AWI 31-102, paragraph 2. Written permission is granted by the authority of the 440 Airlift Wing Commander, or his designee, and is required for entry into these areas.

**10. Restricted Area Warning Signs .** The warning signs utilized in accordance with this instruction, will be displayed along the restricted area boundary at intervals not to exceed 100 feet. The coordination for proper placement of restricted area signs is to be made with 440 Support Group Security Forces.

**11. Posting.** This instruction will be available at all entrances to General Mitchell IAP-ARS, controlled areas, 440 AW Public Affairs office, and 440 Operations Support Flight Base Operations.
